**SUBJECT : REGULATORY UPDATES FOR HOUSEHOLD/URBAN
HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES (HUHS)**

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA), through the Center for Cosmetics and Household/Urban Hazardous Substances Regulation and Research (CCHUHSRR), is undertaking the necessary process to formalize an administrative issuance that aims to streamline regulatory systems and frameworks, thereby contributing to the improvement of efficiency and service delivery. In light of this initiative, the CCHUHSRR hereby issues further regulatory flexibilities in the registration and labeling requirements for HUHS products.

All concerned stakeholders are hereby informed that the transitory period for the mandatory Certificate of Product Registration (CPR) for HUHS products and its labeling requirements under Annex J of FDA Circular 2020-025 will be further extended **until 31 December 2026**, unless otherwise repealed or amended.

Such an extension is without prejudice for the FDA to conduct inspections and perform routine post-market surveillance activities. The FDA maintains its authority to issue the order to ban, recall, withdraw, and/or destroy any health product deemed to be unsafe and injurious for public use.

Relatedly, the extension of HUHS licensing validity in accordance with FDA Advisory No. 2025-0512-A is herein reiterated. Such extension remains effective until the formal announcement of the completion of the ongoing HUHS data migration.

All other stakeholders, including the Bureau of Customs, are requested to consider the above-mentioned regulatory flexibilities relevant for the release of shipments of HUHS products.
