Information gathering

Section 71 Chemicals Management Plan 2023

In June 2023, a notice was published in the <u>Canada Gazette</u>, Part I: Vol. 157, No. 25 – <u>June 24, 2023</u> under section 71 of the <u>Canadian Environmental Protection Act</u>, 1999 (CEPA 1999). This notice applies to 1 substance in this batch, BENPAT (CAS RN 68953-84-4). 2018 Mandatory survey - section 71 notice

In August 2018, a notice was issued in the <u>Canada Gazette</u>, Part I: Vol. 152, No. 34 - August 25, 2018 under section 71 of CEPA 1999. This notice applied to 1 substance in this batch, BENPAT (CAS RN 68953-84-4).

2017 Mandatory survey - section 71 notice

In April 2017, a notice was issued in the <u>Canada Gazette</u>, <u>Part I: Vol. 151, No. 13 - April 1</u>, <u>2017</u> under section 71 of CEPA 1999. This notice applied to one substance in this batch, PREPOD (CAS RN 68412-48-6), as well as approximately <u>30 other substances</u> that are toxic or proposed to be toxic as defined under section 64 of CEPA 1999.

2009 Mandatory survey - section 71 notice

In September 2009, a notice was issued in the <u>Canada Gazette</u>, Part I: Vol. 143, No. 39 - <u>September 26, 2009</u> under section 71 of CEPA 1999. This notice applied to all 16 substances in this batch.

Risk management action milestones

The <u>risk management action milestones</u> table outlines the risk management actions that were proposed for each chemical substance in this batch of the Challenge that met the criteria of section 64 of the <u>CEPA 1999</u>. These proposed risk management actions were published in the risk management approaches for these substances. For the complete wording of these proposed actions, please refer to the risk management approaches.

Ecological State of the Science Report on DEHA

In October 2013, based on new information that was made available after the original screening assessment, an <u>Ecological State of the Science report on DEHA</u> was released. The notice was published in the <u>Canada Gazette</u>, Part I: Vol. 147 No. 41 - October 12, 2013 for a 60-day public comment period.

Adding substances to Schedule 1

Three substances in this batch (DEHA, PREPOD, and BENPAT) were initially proposed to be added to <u>Schedule 1</u>. Following the publication of the proposed order for their addition to Schedule 1, notices of objection and requests for the establishment of boards of review were received for 2 of these substances (DEHA and BENPAT). Both requests to establish boards of review were declined.

Reduced regulatory requirement polymer criteria

Two substances in this batch (<u>MVTFS</u> and <u>MHDnMH</u>) meet the reduced regulatory requirements (RRR) polymer criteria as specified in the <u>New Substances Notification</u> <u>Regulations (NSNR)</u>. Therefore, it is recommended that the Domestic Substances List (DSL) be amended to indicate that these substances meet the RRR polymer criteria (apply a <u>"P" flag</u>). Should other forms of these polymers, not meeting the RRR polymer criteria, be introduced on the Canadian market, those polymers would be considered not listed on the DSL, and subject to the requirements of the NSNR. One order has been published.

Applying Significant New Activity provisions

Varying the requirements under the Significant New Activity provisions

In July 2019, a notice of intent to amend the DSL to vary the requirements under the SNAc provisions for 4 substances in this batch (CAS RNs 603-33-8, 40615-36-9, 64111-81-5 and 125328-28-1) was published in the *Canada Gazette*, Part I: Vol. 153, No. 30 - July 27, 2019 for a 60-day public comment period. The proposed amendments are an outcome of the SNAc Review. The DSL amendments do not come into force until the final order is published in the *Canada Gazette*, Part II. Any current requirements under the SNAc provisions remain in effect until then.

In January 2017, a notice of intent to amend the DSL to vary the requirements under the SNAc provisions for phenyl-D4 (CAS RN 10448-09-6) was published in the <u>Canada Gazette</u>, <u>Part I: Vol. 151, No. 2 - January 14, 2017</u> for a 60-day public comment period. The proposed amendments are an outcome of the SNAc Review. The DSL amendments do not come into force until the final order is published in the <u>Canada Gazette</u>, Part II. Any current requirements under the SNAc provisions remain in effect until then.

Rescinding the requirements under the Significant New Activity provisions

In January 2017, the requirements under the SNAc provisions for MDnM-hydride (CAS RN 69430-47-3) were proposed to be rescinded. This substance was subject to the SNAc provisions as a result of the 2011 screening assessment of substances in this batch. It was later included in the Consumer Product and Stakeholder Priority SNAc Review Group, under the SNAc Review. That review led to the recommendation that the requirements under the SNAc provisions for this substance be rescinded. Also, recent industry surveys revealed that commercial activity for this substance is low, and therefore the likelihood for exposure to humans or the environment is also low. Therefore, a notice of intent to amend the DSL to rescind the requirements under the SNAc provisions was published in the Canada Gazette, Part I: Vol. 151, No. 2 - January 14, 2017 for a 60-day public comment period. Current SNAc requirements remain in effect until the final order is published in the Canada Gazette, Part II.

Final screening assessment and risk management approaches

In September 2011, the final screening assessments for this batch were released and the related notices were published in the *Canada Gazette*, Part I: Vol. 145, No. 37 - September 10, 2011.

The final screening assessments concluded that 3 substances in this batch meet one or more criteria in section 64 of CEPA 1999. The Government has added these substances to Schedule 1 to the Act. In addition, 1 of these substances (CAS RN 68412-48-6), has been found to meet the criteria for <u>virtual elimination</u> under subsection 77(4) of the Act, and therefore is being proposed for addition to the <u>Virtual Elimination List</u>. Proposed risk management approaches were also released on this date for the substances in this batch which met the criteria in section 64 of CEPA 1999.

Draft screening assessments and risk management scopes

New information was received from industry or interested stakeholders for each of the 16 substances in this batch. In October 2010, the draft screening assessments were released and the related notices were published in the *Canada Gazette*, Part I: Vol. 144, No. 40 - October 2, 2010. Risk management scopes were also released in conjunction with these publications.
